- Nevada Revised Statute (NRS) 223.480
- State Administrative Manual (SAM) 3000
- Required reporting to the Office of Federal Assistance done through the online Federal Assistance
 Notification Form
- Historically, it was a PDF emailed to the "Grants Office" but no longer
- STATE AGENCIES ARE REQUIRED TO SUBMIT THEIR NOTICE OF APPLICATION, ANY CHANGES TO AN EXISTING GRANT AWARD, AS WELL AS NOTIFICATION OF CLOSE OUT AND IF FUNDS WILL OR HAVE BEEN UNEXPENDED AT THE END OF GRANT PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE
- Submit via the <u>Federal Assistance Notification Form</u> on our website

NEVADA STATE CLEARINGHOUSE

- AUTHORITY to Apply
- INTERNAL CONTROLS
 - Non-federal entities MUST establish and maintain effective internal controls (2 CFR 200)
- POLICY AND PROCEDURES
- SAM.GOV
 - Required
 - Connected with Grants.gov
 - Official U.S. Government System
 - Provides you with a UEI # (previously DUNS)
 - Find your UEI # by following the <u>steps at SAM.gov</u>


DRAFT YOUR WORK PROGRAM

- A WP is the document used to request changes to a legislatively approved budget or to establish a budget for a non-executive budget account
- Identifies the proposed sources of funds to be received by an agency
- Demonstrate the plan as to how the money will be spent
- NRS 353.220
 - Determines if a WP goes to the Interim Finance Committee (IFC)
 - Threshold is \$75,000

GOVERNOR'S FINANCE OFFICE

- REMEMBER IDENTIFY WHO IS DOING THE WP
 - i.e., Administrative Services Division
- WPs CAN BE SUBMITTED AS SOON AS YOU RECEIVE YOUR NOTICE OF AWARD (NOA, NOGA)
- REMEMBER DEADLINES AND BACK-UP DOCUMENTATION
 - Open your lines of communication
 - Update periodically on anticipated or unanticipated changes
 - Gather appropriate documentation even prior to your NOA to have it ready to submit
 - If you are shy of a deadline, notify your budget person and troubleshoot
 - Have your back up documentation so it does not get sent back
 - Ask questions



SINGLE AUDIT AND FEDERAL GRANT REPORTING

SINGLE AUDIT AND CASH MANAGEMENT REPORTING ACTIVITIES INCLUDE

- Preparation of the U.S. Treasury-state agreement
- Preparation of memorandum of agreements
- Provide single audit training to state agencies
- Preparation of the schedule of expenditures of federal awards
- Compilation of prior year audit findings
- Preparation of cash management improvement act annual report

FOR STATE AGENCIES

- State of Nevada must be in compliance with the Single Audit Act Amended in 1996
- Each state agency receiving federal funds is required to provide information requested
- SUBMIT ON THE SINGLE AUDIT CERTIFICATION FORM OR SAC
- MOST RECENT SINGLE AUDIT REPORT CAN BE FOUND HERE

INTERIM FINANCE COMMITTEE

- <u>IFC</u> (NRS 218E.400)
- Composed of members of the Senate Committee on Finance and the Assembly
 Committee on Ways and Means from preceding session
- Functions within the Legislative Counsel Bureau (LCB)
- Reviews state agency requests to accept certain gifts and grants
- Reviews modifications
- Find information on the LCB website
- <u>Subscribe</u> to email notifications to receive meeting notices & budget division policy directives as well as all agency memos
- Next scheduled meeting
 - JUNE 14, 2023 AT 9 AM
 - AGENCY DEADLINE FOR ITEMS APRIL 26, 2023



PASS-THROUGH ENTITY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Establishes a prime to nonfederal entity relationship
- Prime is considered the PTE
- Responsible in ensuring
 - Compliance with a Federal grant award
 - Monitoring and ensuring compliance with all federal requirements of each subrecipient

Relationship	2 CFR 200.1 Definition							
Contractor	Any entity that receives a contract							
Federal Agency	Any agency as defined under 5 USC 55(1) and further clarified under 5 USC 552(f)							
Non-federal Entity	A state, local government, Indian Tribe, institution of higher education, or nonprofit organization that carries out a federal award as a recipient or subrecipient							
Pass-through Entity	A non-federal entity that provides a subaward to a subrecipient to carry out part of a federal program							
Recipient	An entity, generally a non-federal entity, that receives a federal award directly from a federal awarding agency							
Subrecipients	An entity, generally a non-federal entity, that receives a subaward from a pass-through entity to carry out part of a federal award							


SUBAWARDING

- 2 CFR 200.1 and SAM 3022
- Evaluate the substance of the relationship to determine if a relationship is that of a subrecipient or contractor
- Don't FORGET check for suspensions and debarments for your vendor <u>HERE</u>

Subrecipient	Contractor				
Carries out a portion of a federal award and creates a federal assistance relationship with the subrecipient	Obtains goods or provides services for the non-federal entity and creates a procurement relationship				
Determines who is eligible to receive federal assistance	Provides goods/services within normal business operations				
Measures performance to determine if the federal program objectives were met	Provides similar goods/services to many different purchasers				
Responsible for programmatic decision-making	Normally operates in a competitive environment				
Responsible for adherence to program requirements specified in the federal award	Provides goods/services ancillary to federal program				
Utilize federal funds to carry out the program for the benefit of the public as specified in the award/statute, etc.	Not subject to compliance requirements as a result of the agreement but may have other requirements related to state procurement rules				

SUBAWARDING

- Many state agencies in Nevada function as a PTE or Prime Recipient distributing awarded funding to subrecipients for implementation.
- The agency may distribute the funds to subrecipients through a competitive process for implementation
- The agency may distribute funds to subrecipients in a noncompetitive manner




FEDERAL FUNDING ACCOUNTABILITY & TRANSPARENCY ACT (FFATA)

- FEDERAL SUBAWARD REPORTING SYSTEM (FSRS)
- REVISIT THE NEVADA CONTROLLER'S OFFICE INTRANET
- THIS TRANSPARENCY ACT requires information disclosures concerning entities receiving Federal financial assistance through
 Federal awards, i.e., contracts, sub-contracts, grants, and sub-grants
- INFORMATION IS MADE available on a publicly available website (<u>USASpending</u>) that contains the following information
 - ✓ The name of the entity receiving the award.
 - ✓ The amount of the award.
 - ✓ Information on the award including transaction type, funding agency, the North American Industry Classification System code (NAICS) or Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA) number, program source, and an award title descriptive of the purpose of each funding action.
 - ✓ The location of the entity receiving the award and the primary location of performance under the award including the city, state, congressional district, and country.
 - ✓ A unique identifier of the entity receiving the award and of the parent entity of the recipient, should the entity be owned by another entity.
 - ✓ The names and total compensation of the five highest-paid officers of an entity if, in the preceding fiscal year, that entity received: 80% or more of its annual gross revenues in Federal awards, \$25,000,000 or more in annual gross revenues from Federal awards, and the public does not already have access to data on executive compensation through reports filed under section 13(a) or 15(d) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, or section 6104 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.
 - ✓ Any other relevant information specified by OMB.
